They will be able to recognise the story of Palm Sunday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday and some religious signs and symbols of Ash Wednesday, Lent and Easter Sunday and use some religious words and phrases. CORE The children will be able to recognise that people use the opportunity of Lent to change and make a new start. We follow the Read, Write, Inc Scheme for Reading. Our vehicle text is: 'Where The Wild Things Are' by Maurice Sendak Children will write a portal story. Children will write an information text about 'Wild Things'. **English** Children will engage in daily sentence accuracy work that allows them to say out loud what they plan to write, compose a sentence orally before writing and develop basic skills in using capital letters and punctuation correctly.
