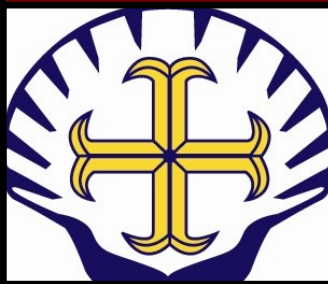

News from Year 1

In Y1, we started our History topic with an activity about Chronology. We learned about how time periods can overlap. We used cubes to build towers to represent how far things



went into the past.

We looked at the ages of our friends, teachers and school and how long our teachers were alive before our school was built. We counted the cubes to show the number of years our school was open before we were born! It was easy to see which teachers were the youngest and oldest!



We have also been learning about the human body and how our senses help us. This week, we put our senses to the test in an exciting science experiment. We did some blind taste, smell and feeling tests and made our guesses! We could smell oranges and soap, and taste marshmallows, crisps and lemon!
