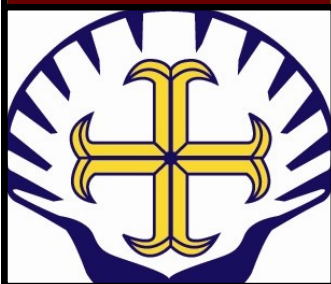

4D were delighted to hear they were the winning Junior class.

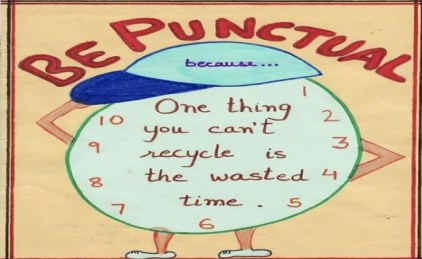
It is wonderful to see the children so devoted to being in school and the excitement of who is going to be the winning class.
