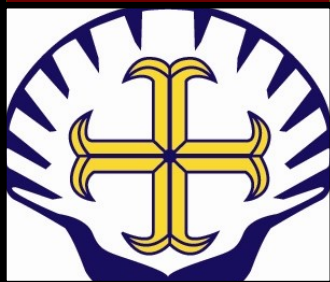

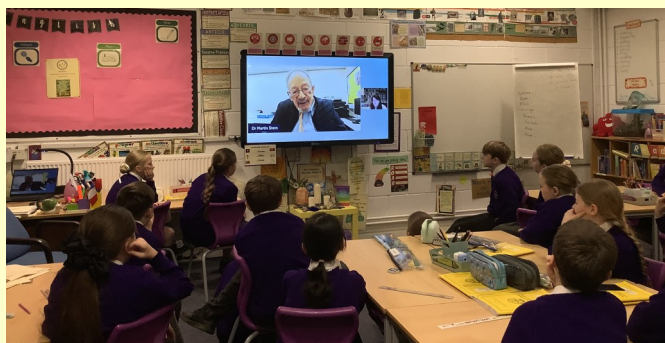


Inside, we have loved chilling out in our Winter Wonderland: dressing up, sharing seasonal stories and sculpting snowmen with snowdough.

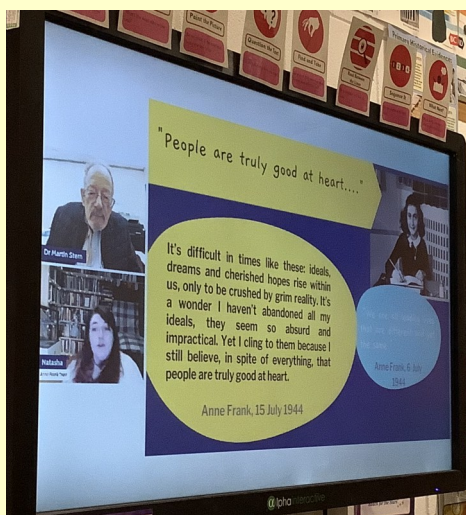
## Holocaust Memorial Day 2026
