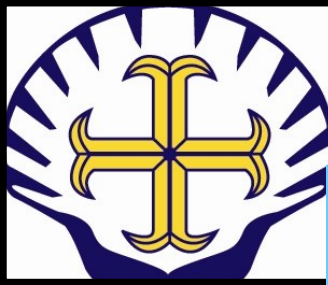

They achieved nationally recognized levels and were awarded lovely certificates.

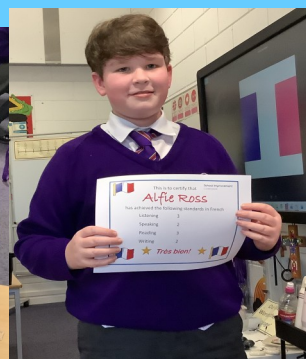
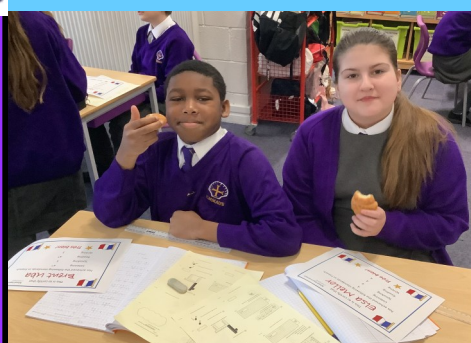
To celebrate their achievements, the children enjoyed a treat of croissants and pain au chocolates from Madam Perez.

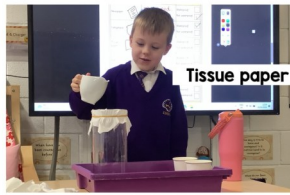

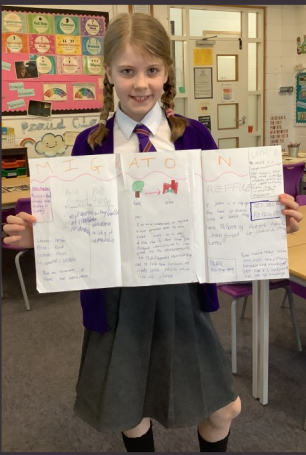


Well Done Laura

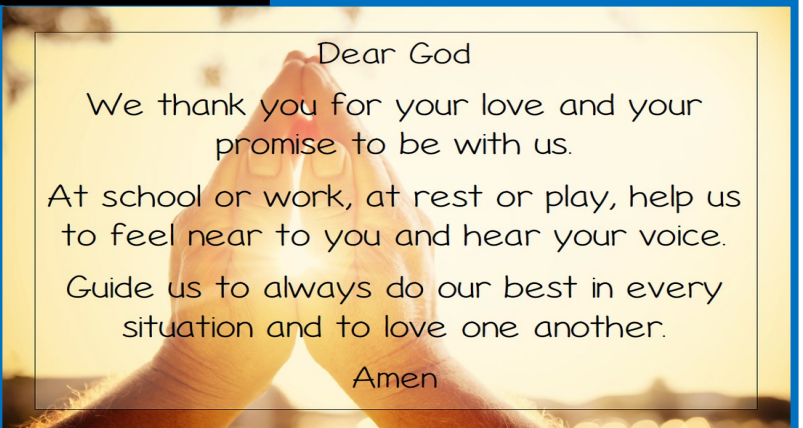

We think it looks absolutely amazing, a big 'Well Done'!

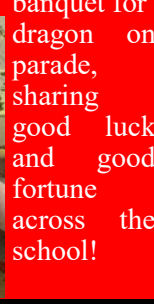


Lunar New Year Celebrations in Early Years
