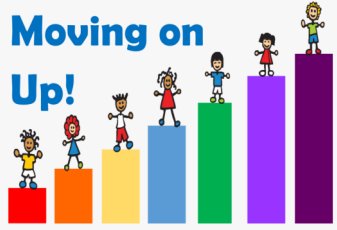

News from Year 2

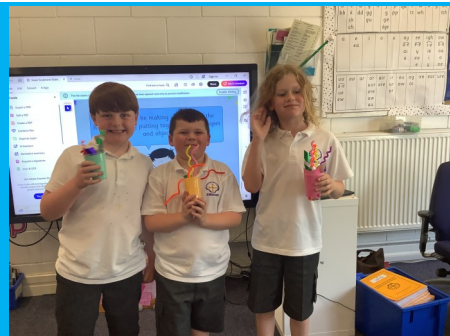
The children in Year 2 came up with their own ideas this week to manage their enjoyment in school in the heatwave.
