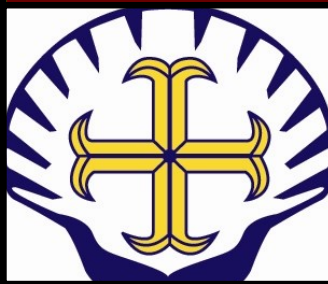

We are delighted with our new signing-in system which has proved an invaluable way forward in updating our registration, security and safeguarding in school.

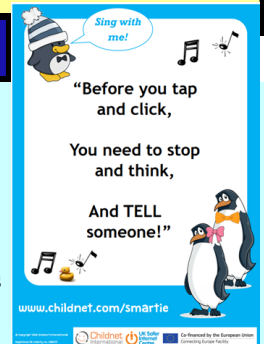

Well done Year 1, you are so clever!



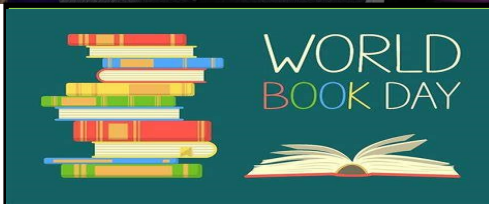

World Book Day

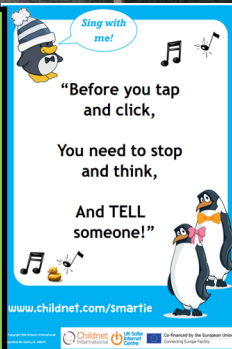
World Book Day falls on Thursday 6th March this year and we will be celebrating it in school on this day.

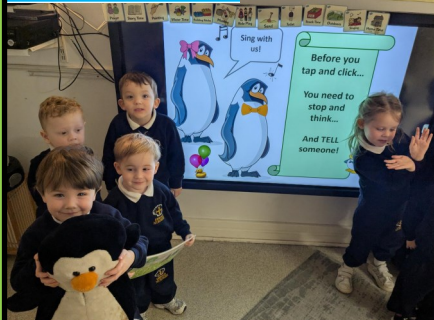
Safer Internet Day in Nursery
