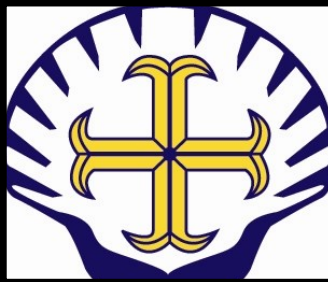

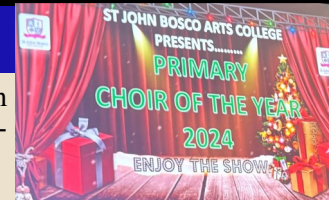

Compost your food waste

Composting your food waste rather than sending it to the landfill can drastically reduce your carbon footprint. When composting you are reducing your methane emissions, methane is a greenhouse gas that is 72% more harmful than carbon dioxide.

When food scraps can properly be broken down and decomposed, the waste produces carbon dioxide and can eventually be used as nutrient rich soil for growing food.
