You will get to have the attendance mascots in your classes next week and enjoy a biscuit treat.

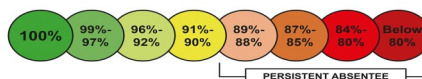
Next week, is of course, the final week of this half-term.

### Message from Merseyside Police

Please be reminded that Merseyside Police are making regular visits to our school to target the unsafe parking issue.

Common issues include:

Parking on yellow or white zig-zags – these are in place to provide a clear and unobstructed view for those crossing the road. By parking here you significantly increase the risk of a child being hit by a vehicle, it is also an offence.

Parking close to a junction – you should park at least 10 meters away from a junction, close to the kerb and facing in the direction of the traffic flow. This is again to provide a clear view for those crossing the road, but also to provide drivers with sufficient space to manoeuvre safely. Unnecessary obstruction is an offence.

Exiting the vehicle – it is safest for your passengers to get out of your vehicle on the side next to the kerb. This is to prevent them being struck by a vehicle and reduce obstruction of the highway whilst your doors are open. It is an offence to open a vehicle door in a manner which causes a danger.

“They’re doing it...” – do not justify unsafe parking to yourself just because someone else is doing it. You are responsible for your own decision making.

**Officers will be in the area giving advice to drivers, issuing penalty notices, and removing vehicles if necessary.**
