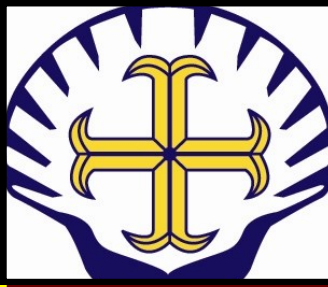

Choose clothing made from natural fibres.

An estimated 9 percent of the micro-plastics in the ocean are coming from synthetic fibres—the kind found in materials like nylon, acrylic, polyester, and fleece. They're shed from the clothes we wear, and make their way from our washing machines to wastewater plants, before spreading throughout the environment. When possible, choose clothing and textiles made of natural materials, like cotton and wool, instead. Thank you
