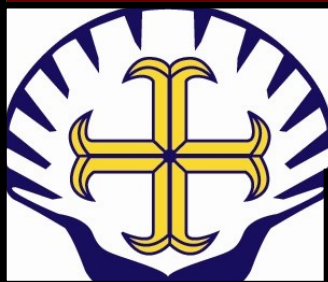

Thank you for supporting our 'French Day' in school today. How lovely to see the sea of Red, White and Blue around school.

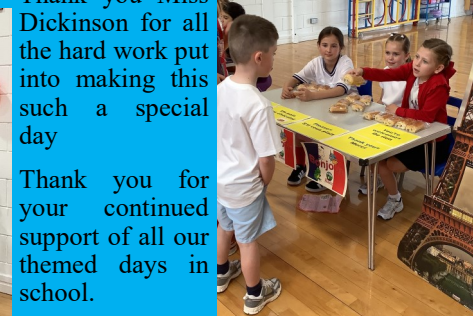


All of the children enjoyed a 'Pain au Chocolat' and a drink supplied by our wonderful Friends of Emmaus.
