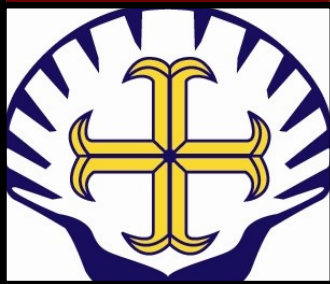

Y5 France Residential 2025

Last week, 27 of our Year 5 children travelled to France on our annual residential. After a 5:00 am start on Monday and a long coach ride, they arrived at the beautiful Château du Broutel in Rue in the Somme area of Picardie. The first evening activity was 'Mini-Olympics' where the children headed off in groups to explore the Château before heading up to find their dorms for the week and to get a restful night's sleep. On Tuesday, the children filled up on a French breakfast of croissants and pains au chocolat before heading out to explore a French market at Etapes. After lunch in the park, we then headed to a chocolaterie where the children learned how chocolate is made and tried some delicious French treats! On Wednesday, the children had the opportunity to explore several significant places from the Battle of Somme where the children reflected on the lives lost during the war. They visited the Basilique Notre Dame de Brebières, The Somme 1916 Museum in Albert, Lochnagar Crater- Le cratère de la Boisselle, Thiepval War Memorial to the Missing of the Somme and WW1 trenches at The Newfoundlanders Memorial before heading back to the Château for more fun and games before bed. On Thursday, the children headed to a snail farm where they learned all about how snails are bred. They even got to try some delicious snails before having a tour of Rue in the afternoon where they used their French to order ice cream and drinks in a local café. To finish the week, the children headed to the supermarché to spend the last of their Euros on some French treats to take home. The children were brilliant all week and we are so proud of them all!
